Please Read Rules and Regulations Carefully For Your Benefit.

Rules & Restrictions –

- 1) Dogs shall be leashed at all times. Exhibitors will be charged \$35 for each occurrence that a dog is found off leash. Dogs are prohibited anywhere near permanent boarding barns. Owners MUST clean up after dogs. (OHC rules)
- 2) Limit of one pony/cob per stall unless it's a mare/foal combination or weanlings.
- 3) No trailer tie-ups allowed although haul-ins may stay in their trailer. Exhibitor will be charged for OHC cleanup unless manure, shaving and garbage are removed from around the trailer when leaving the premises.
- 4) Exhibitor will be charged for any excessive damage done to stalls or facilities. Nails, staples, labels, etc must be removed from all stalls or the exhibitor will be charged for OHC cleanup.
- 5) Exhibitors will be charged an additional \$10 fee per stall for the use of bedding not purchased through OHC.
- 6) Manure Disposal shall be in designated areas only. Use garbage cans for trash and do not mix with the manure. Exhibitors will be charged \$40 for trash left in tack rooms/stalls so please clean up!
- 7) Any abuse toward a pony/cob/half-Welsh or show official will be cause for immediate ejection from the show without refund.

Eligibility:

All ponies/cobs/half-Welsh must be registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc or, if under one year, be eligible for registration. Only animals registered with the Welsh Pony and Cob Society of America, Inc. will receive points. An animal must be shown under his full registered Welsh number and name. Before an animal is assigned a number or enters the ring, the Show Secretary must have a copy of the Welsh Certificate of Registration in the current owner's name and current Coggins test, when required. If the animal is under one year and not yet registered, submit a copy of the dam's Certificate of Registration, the registration number and registered name of the sire and the proposed registration name of entry. Unnamed foals may not be shown. A breeding pony may not be shown in both Section A and Section B classes, nor may a cob be shown in both Section C and Section D classes during the same year. All lease agreements must be officially recorded through the Society office. All recorded leases are designated as such on animal's Certificate of Registration. Leased animals being shown must present a copy of registration listing the lessee.

Class Add/Deletes:

No charge for added/exchanged classes by 6pm prior day

\$ 5 per class for same day additions/exchanges

No refunds for deletions

Added classes must be paid for at time of add. Open checks accepted.

Stall Fees:

Stall fees based upon a 24 hour period from midnite to midnite. Exhibitor will be charged if a stall is occupied for anytime during that 24 hour period. Must include arriving and departing day.

Haul-in	\$10 per day
Day stall	\$ 25 (no overnights)

One overnight stall (includes two days and one night) \$36 (no bedding included)
Stalls / Tack Stalls \$65 (no bedding included)

Payment of Fees:

A completed and signed check must accompany entries. Numbers will not be handed out until payment and all paperwork is received. Exhibitors will be required to leave an open check with any changes/additions/orders that are made at the show. Returned checks will be subject to a \$35 fee, and must be cleared within 30 days of the last day of the show, or disciplinary actions will be sought through the WPCSA.

Penalties:

Post-entry \$25 per pony. **Please submit entries by Aug. 10th though no late penalties will be enforced until the show has 75 ponies entered. Please, please, please send in your entries on time and make the lives of the volunteer staff easier!! Again, this show is being put on by a combination of volunteers from across the West Coast and we truly hope to have the support of the West Coast Welsh community so that this show (and others like it) may continue to be put on in the future.**

Refund Policy:

Full refunds will be given if written notice is received by the Show Secretary before the closing of entries August 10th, 2011. Exhibitors scratching a pony for any reason after the closing date shall forfeit all entry and association fees, UNLESS a valid Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate of disability for entered pony or rider is submitted to the Show Secretary PRIOR to the first event of the show, in which case a \$30.00 fee will be assessed. If illness or injury after the start of the show should prevent exhibitor's participation in the balance of entered classes, a refund of unused class fees will be made, less a \$30.00 office fee, providing the balance of the classes are officially scratched and a Doctor's certificate is provided within 48 hours of the close of the show. Stall fees will not be refunded for any 24 hour period the pony/cob have occupied the stalls. Association fees will not be refunded.

Entries:

Copy of BOTH SIDES of the Registration papers MUST accompany each entry. If you have a current measurement card, please include a copy of it . Exhibitor numbers will not be issued until ALL paperwork is in.

Bedding:

USE ORDER FORM TO HAVE BEDDING DELIVERED TO YOUR STALL.

Bedding must be paid for in advance of delivery along with entry forms. Bedding is \$ 8.00/bale for pine shavings, which includes delivery to stalls. Exhibitors will be charged an additional \$10 fee per stall for the use of bedding not purchased through OHC.

Early Arrivals:

Please contact the Oregon Horse Center no later than 7 days in advance to make arrangements for early arrival to have stalls unlocked. Cost is \$15 per day. Call Heather Engstrom at 541-689-9700. Office hours are 9am-6pm. Stalls will be assigned in advance so entries must be received in a timely manner to accommodate stall requests and bedding delivery for early arrival.

Measurement:

All Halter animals 6 years and over, and all performance animals must present a copy of a WPCSA or (AHSA) USEF permanent measurement card or measurement conducted during current competition year, or be measured. Measurements to occur: **by appointment.**

Exhibitors, parents and/or guardians of minor exhibitors

shall indemnify and hold harmless the Oregon Welsh Pony Society, its Officers, Directors, Agents and Members, and the Oregon Horse Center, their officers, employees, and/or all Horse Show Officials and Employees from any and all liability resulting from injury and/or loss sustained by any person, child, or

ward of such parent/guardian, in any manner occasioned.

Safety First:

The safety of our exhibitors, their animals, and the public is our highest concern. Please keep your animals under control at all times and do not put them in dangerous situations. Be especially mindful of children, either inside or outside the show ring. **For animals in harness, animals must be fully bridled while hitching and unhitching. Removing the bridle from an animal harnessed to a vehicle, or leaving an animal unattended while hitched anywhere on the showgrounds will result in the instant elimination and removal from the show grounds.**

Junior Exhibitors:

Must wear approved protective headgear (ASTM/SEI) at all times whenever mounted or in a driven vehicle at all times while on the show ground. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is in place.

Awards:

Ribbons 1st-5th places
Awards for Supreme and Youth Classes

Stakes Classes:

To qualify for an award, an exhibitor must enter and compete in all classes in the division. Monies will be awarded for the placing as follows: \$20 to first place and \$10 to second place. In the event that the classes are split, the original stakes monies will be split between the two divisions.

Division Championship:

In case of a tie, (except hunter) it shall be settled by the flip of a coin or by a work-off per the decisions of the winning entrants. In case of a tie in the hunter division, the championship or reserve will be awarded to the animal that accumulated the most points over fences. If animals have an equal number of points over fences, they must be shown at a walk, trot and canter using the same judging specifications as in the classes offered in the division. No championship points can be awarded in any division unless all three of the scheduled classes in that division have been held. All three of the WPCSA division classes must have three or more exhibitors showing in each class for championship points to be awarded. Points for championships will be calculated as follows for all performance divisions: 1st - 5 points, 2nd - 3 points, 3rd - 2 points, 4th - 1 point.

OWPS Annual Year End Awards and NW High Point Awards:

In order to accumulate points for the year-end awards, you must have an active current membership in place prior to the start of the show for the show points to count.

Juniors are **NOT** allowed to show stallions. Any unruly animal may be asked to leave the show.

Management reserves unto itself the right to refuse or cancel any entries, disqualify riders, drivers, or exhibitors without incurring claim for damages. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy and/or disobedience to the judges, officials, staff or committee on the part of the owner, rider or groom shall disqualify the animal and the owner will forfeit his/her entry and other fees.

Courses will be posted at least one hour before the scheduled time of the class. Extra copies may be available at the Show Secretary's Office.

Two (2) minute Gate Rule:

To be strictly enforced. Additional three (3) minutes will be allowed for requested tack change. The Gate will not be held for more than five (5) minutes.

Concessions:

A variety of good food is available on the show grounds on all show days

Veterinarian, Farrier, Medical – all listed in Show Office.

Show Office Hours: Will be posted at the Show Office.

OWPS is a non-profit organization and relies upon generous contributors to offset the costs of the shows. Directions to The Oregon Horse Center

From I-5

I-5 to Eugene - Take Beltline Exit 195B

Head West on Beltline towards Junction City/Airport.

Travel approximately six miles. Take N.W. Expressway Exit 7B. Turn right at stop sign. Travel approximately two miles north on N.W. Expressway.

Watch for Oregon Horse Center on right-hand side of road.

From HWY 99

Turn East on Awbrey Lane - adjacent to Eugene Airport.

Travel approximately one mile to the end of Awbrey Lane.

The Oregon Horse Center will be visible just to your Right.

Class Specifications

WPCSA BREED CLASSES (Article 110.2)

Animals are to be shown in hand at a walk and a trot except in group classes. Purebred Welsh to be judged 85% on breed type, conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on disposition and manners. Natural reaching action is desired. Half-Welsh to be judged 85% on conformation, way of going, quality and substance and 15% on Welsh breed type, disposition and manners.

WPCSA WELSH ENGLISH PLEASURE (Article 112.3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring on light contact without a martingale. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25 % on breed type and conformation. Working class to be judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA WELSH WESTERN PLEASURE (Article 112.4)

To be shown at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring without a martingale, on a reasonably loose rein, without undue restraint. To be judged on performance, with emphasis on manners 65%; breed type, conformation and movement 25%; appointments 10%. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA PLEASURE DRIVING (Article 113.1)

To be shown to a suitable two or four-wheeled vehicle or four-wheeled vehicle for pairs, but not a viceroy, racing sulky or fine harness rig. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, working trot and trot on and stand quietly and except for tandems, **to back readily**. A properly attired groom or passenger is required for all pairs, tandems, unicorns or 4 in hand, capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes are judged 100% on performance.

WPCSA CARRIAGE DRIVING (Article 113.2)

(wire wheeled vehicles can be used if stated in prize list.) Classes open to ponies/cobs/half-Welsh. In addition to the gaits detailed in the pleasure driving section (Article 113.1.11) (walk, working trot, strong trot, halt and rein back). Carriage driving also requires the slow trot where the animal should maintain forward impulsion while showing submission to the bit. A properly attired groom or passenger is required for all pairs, tandems, unicorns or 4 in hand, capable of rendering assistance in case of an emergency. Failure to comply will result in elimination from the class. Turnout to be judged 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going. Working class to be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going; 20% on condition and fit of harness and vehicle; 10% on neatness of attire. Obstacle/Cones to be judged 100% on performance. Refer to specifications in rulebook for the type of obstacle/cones classes being offered.

WPCSA LEADING REIN (Article 115.1)

Section A, B, C or half-Welsh, mare or gelding, 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but not more than eight, years of age. **Ponies to be judged** on manners, suitability, breed type, conformation and turn-out. This is not an equitation class. **There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.**

WPCSA CHILD'S FIRST PONY (Article 115.2)

Section A, B, C and half-Welsh, mare or gelding 12.2 hands and under, to be ridden by junior exhibitors at least four, but no more than 10, years of age. Riders to be suitably dressed in Hunt, Saddle or Western attire including protective headgear. Ponies to be shown at a walk and trot or jog, both ways of the ring. **Ponies to be judged** on performance, manners and suitability. Conformation, way of going, manners, suitability and turnout to be emphasized. This is not an equitation class. **There are no restrictions for the pony or rider.**

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk-trot, and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk and trot/jog. To stand quietly. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. No chain leadlines. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot poles.

WPCSA LEADLINE WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.4)

Classes open to riders 7 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. To be led by an adult or a junior age 12 or over. Both handler and rider to be appropriately attired. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, leadline walk and leadline walk-trot .

WPCSA WALK (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk-trot and walk-trot poles. To walk both ways of the ring.

WPCSA WALK-TROT (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To walk and trot/jog both ways of the ring. Possible test to include: walk, trot/jog, turn, halt and rein back at spots marked. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot poles.

WPCSA WALK-TROT POLES (Article 115.5)

Classes open to riders 11 & under mounted on ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. Judged on equitation and suitability of mount. To be ridden once around a course of four poles on the ground entirely at a walk or entirely at a trot/jog. Poles are to be placed at a minimum of 4 feet off the rail, two on each side of the ring, simulating a hunter course. The poles should be placed far enough away from the entrance gate to provide an adequate sized area to do an opening and closing circle. English or Western attire is acceptable. **RIDERS** ineligible for other ridden classes except costume, leading rein, child's first pony, walk and walk-trot.

WPCSA JUNIOR WELSH HANDLER (Article 115.6)

Judged on the ability and skill of the Junior in handling their pony/cob/half-Welsh as in the breed ring. The show qualities of the pony/cob/half-Welsh shall not be considered, although cleanliness and grooming can be considered. Exhibitors enter to the left so as not to obscure the judge's view. The judge evaluates the ability of the junior to follow directions, use space wisely, and execute the requested patterns. Juniors should appear "ring wise", be alert to the judging progression and be prepared for changes in the judging routine.

WPCSA WELSH HUNTER (Article 112.5)

To be judged 75% on performance, manners, movement and style; 25% on breed type and conformation. Working classes judged 100% on performance. Animals not exceeding 13.2 hands will jump 2'0"; animals exceeding 13.2 shall jump 2'6".

Over fences (o/f): To be shown over a course of a minimum of **six** fences with eight jumping efforts of the required height.

Under saddle (u/s): To be eligible, pony must have shown in and completed an over fence class. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. **May be required to hand gallop one way of the ring, but no more than eight animals at one time.**

WPCSA SHORT STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.6)

Division is open to riders 12 years and under. Classes are open to all ponies/cobs/half-Welsh, mares and geldings. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division except Short Stirrup equitation. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. May either trot or canter the entire course. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. To be eligible for the under-saddle class, animal must have shown in **and completed** an over-fences class. Under-saddle class animals will be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter.

WPCSA LONG STIRRUP HUNTER (Article 112.7) -Ages 13 to Adult

Classes are open to all ponies/cobs and Half-Welsh. **RIDERS** in this division, including the under saddle class, may not compete over fences in any other division at that show where the fences exceed 18". There are no restrictions for animals exhibiting in these classes. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences and 8 jumping efforts required. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle class. To be judged 100% on performance. May trot or canter the entire course.

WPCSA LOW HUNTER (Article 112.8)

Division is open to ponies/cobs and half-Welsh, Juniors and Adults. These **ANIMALS** may not compete in any other over fences division at that show where fence heights exceed 18". There are no restrictions on the rider. Courses to be set at 18" with a minimum of 4 fences with 8 jumping efforts required. Over-fence classes must precede the under-saddle classes. To be judged 100% on performance. May either trot or canter the entire course.
